The elevated, 2.25 mile-long guideway will have six stations as well as pedestrian bridges to airport terminals, parking garages and fixed facilities.

The project is a complex and challenging element of the Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP), which would create a world-class transportation system for Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). Estimated at US\$5.5 billion, LAMP would be one of the largest construction programs in Los Angeles City history.
